Stone Disease Patient Advisory Group

The Patient Advisory Group was set up in November 2009 by the BAUS Section of Endourology and consists of two surgeons (one of whom must be a member of the Section of Endourology Executive Committee) and five patient representatives.

The purpose of the group is to seek patients' views and advice on:

- the needs & requirements for information relating to stone disease
- research priorities and input into research trial design & management
- service design and improved facilities for treating stone disease



The group's first priority is to ensure that patients with a kidney stone should have readily accessible information and be able to find out the location of their nearest endourologist.
